An NOC team may be formed with an entry in at least three (3) out of the four disciplines.

B.3. TYPE OF ALLOCATION OF QUOTA PLACES:

The quota place(s) is/are allocated to the NOC by event. The selection of athletes for its allocated quota places is at the discretion of the NOC subject to the athlete meeting the eligibility requirements in C. Athlete Eligibility.

C. Athlete Eligibility

All athletes participating in the YOG must respect and comply with the provisions of the Olympic Charter currently in force. Only those athletes who respect and comply with the Olympic Charter, the World Anti-Doping Code and the Olympic Movement Code on the Prevention of the Manipulation of Competitions, including the conditions of participation established by the IOC, as well as with the rules of the International Skating Union (ISU), may participate in the YOG.

C.1. AGE REQUIREMENTS:

To be eligible to participate in the Winter Youth Olympic Games Gangwon 2024, all male and female athletes must be born between 1 January 2006 and 31 December 2009.

	D.7.4 The eight (8) qualified Teams will compete only in the Free Skating/Free Dance. Each skater will earn Team Points through the Team Competition and the aggregated Team Points will define the overall Team Event result (see paragraph 4 of Appendix A below).		
	D.7.5 NOCs must enter athletes in at least (3) disciplines in the Team Event. If an NOC has qualified skaters in all four (4) disciplines, the respective NOC may enter all four (4) disciplines but only the three (3) best results (Team Points earned as per Annex A) will count for the calculation of the Team Event result. In this case, the lowest team points earned by the NOC will not be taken into account.		
	D.7.6 Only one (1) skater/pair/couple per discipline per NOC will participate in the Team Event. An NOC who has two (2) qualified entries in a discipline, must decide which skater/pair/couple to nominate for the Team Event in the respective discipline. If an NOC has only one (1) entry in a competition in three (3) disciplines, these skaters/pairs/couples cannot choose to skate only in the individual YOG competition and skip the Team Event.		
	D.7.7. The eight (8) qualified Teams will compete only in the Free Skating/Free Dance. Each skater will earn Team Points through the Team Competition and the aggregated Team Points will define the overall Team Event result (see paragraph 4 of Appendix A below). If a NOC has entries in all 4 disciplines of the Team Event, only the best 3 results (by team points) will be considered into the calculation of the final result.		





HOST COUNTRY PLACES

The Host Country is allocated a quota of one (1) Man Singles Skater, one (1) Woman Singles Skater, one (1) Pair Skating and one (1) Ice Dance Couple. Should the Host Country not qualify through **D. Qualification Pathway** in any of the individual event(s), then they will be allocated the last qualification place of the respective event(s). The selection of athletes is at the discretion of the Host Country while respecting the eligibility criteria as detailed in **C. Athlete Eligibility**.

If the Host Country has entries in at least 3 individual events (Men Single Skating, Women Single Skating, Pair Skating or Ice Dance) but did not qualify in the Team Event as per the Figure Skating Team Event Qualifying System, the Host Country will be allocated the last qualification place in the Team Event.

E. Confirmation Process for Quota Places

Following each qualification event, the ISU will publish the results on its website (https://isu.org/).

Within one (1) week of the conclusion of each the qualifying event, as described above in **D. Qualification Pathway**, the ISU will announce the allocation of quota places through an ISU Communication and NOCs will then have two (2) weeks to confirm their use of these quota places to the ISU and Gangwon 2024 Sport Entries as detailed in **G. Qualification Timeline.**

The Qualified NOCs for the Team Event will be officially informed by the ISU Secretariat shortly after the ISU Grand Prix of Figure Skating Final in December 2023 and must enter their skaters/couples by respecting the entry deadlines applicable for the Winter Youth Olympic Games Gangwon 2024.

F. Reallocation of Unused Quota Places

REALLOCATION OF UNUSED QUALIFICATION PLACES

If an allocated quota place is not confirmed by the NOC by the confirmation of quota place deadline or is declined by the NOC, the quota place will be reallocated to the next best ranked NOC, not yet qualified, in the respective event from the 2023/24 ISU Junior Grand Prix of Figure Skating stand-by list.

The stand-by list will be published in an ISU Communication not later than **30 October 2023** after the completion of the ISU Junior Grand Prix series.

Unfilled quota places in an individual event cannot be reallocated to fill a quota place in another individual event nor can it be reallocated to another discipline in Skating.

REALLOCATION OF UNUSED HOST COUNTRY PLACE

If the Host Country qualifies through **D. Qualification Pathway** or if it declines any of its quota places or if the host country's athletes are not eligible pursuant to **C. Athlete Eligibility**, then the quota place(s) will be reallocated to the next best ranked NOC according to **Reallocation of Unused Quota Places**.

2) CONFIRMATION AND ENTRY PROCEDURE

If an NOC has two (2) entries in an individual Youth Olympic Winter Games competition/discipline then the NOC must confirm the name of the participants who will compete in the Free Skating/Dance of the Team Event on January 31, 2024 at 16h00 in the Team Confirmation Meeting.

3) STARTING ORDER

The starting order in the Team Event (Free Skating and Free Dance) will be the reverse order of the respective final result of the individual event.

4) ISU JUDGING SYSTEM - RESULT DETERMINATION

The ISU Judging System as described in the 2022 ISU Special Regulations Single and Pair Skating/Ice Dance shall apply, in particular but not limited to Rule 352 and Rule 353.

To determine the result after the Free Skating/Free Dance and for the final result of the Team Event, the following rule will be used:

After the skater/couple has skated for their respective team, points will be awarded to the team according to the place in each event:

1st	8 placement points
2nd	7 placement points
3rd	6 placement points
4th	5 placement points
5th	4 placement points
6th	3 placement points
7th	2 placement points
8th	1 placement points

Please note:

If an NOC has entries in 4 disciplines in the Team Event, only the best three (3) earned Team Points will be used to calculate the total Team Points of the respective NOC. The lowest earned Team Points will NOT be used in the calculation of the total Team Points.

The Team having earned the highest number of aggregate Team Points is the winner. The Team having earned the second highest number of Team Points is ranked second and so on.

When forming the intermediate and final result, in case of a tie between Teams, the tie breaking procedure will be used taking into consideration:

- a) In case of a tie, the tie breaking procedure will be used, taking into consideration the two (2) best places of the concerned teams in different categories. The highest total team points from the two (2) best places will prevail and the respective places will be recorded accordingly.
- b) If ties persist, the highest total segment scores of the two (2) best skaters/couples forming the tie will prevail and the respective places will be recorded.
- c) If there is still a tie, the teams which are tied will receive the same place.

5) MEDALS/AWARDS

The Teams ranked 1 to 3 will be awarded with the Youth Olympic Gold, Silver and Bronze medals and Youth Olympic Diplomas.

Only skaters who competed in the Team Event will receive a medal respectively a diploma as applicable. Each Team nominates a captain from their Team members who represents the Team.

6) TECHNICAL OFFICIALS

The ISU will appoint all Technical Officials (ISU Referees, ISU Technical Controllers, ISU Technical Specialists, ISU Data & Replay Operators) that shall be among the same Officials also officiating the individual YOG Figure Skating competitions.

7) PANEL OF JUDGES

The Panel of Judges will remain the same as in the Individual Events at the Winter Youth Olympic Games.
